

2014 WILDCAT REUNION

The 2014 Wildcat Reunion, in honor of all LVHS alumni, was held on September 13 at the Orleans Hotel and Casino. There was a total of 520 attendees. Alumni came from all corners of the continental U.S. (including Arizona, Arkansas, Connecticut, Florida, Idaho, Iowa, Kansas, Massachusetts, Maryland, Montana, North Carolina, Oregon, Texas and Washington) plus Hawaii. Our oldest attendees were Lina Pinjuv Sharp (class of 1937) and Nancy Marriott Austin (class of 1939). Our youngest attendees were three of our 2014 scholarship winners (Marissa Gomez, Arianne Monzon and Steven Salas) plus Monica Kim-Zamora from the class of 2014.

There were 22 attendees from classes of the 1940s. Although the majority of attendees were from the 50's through the 70's, we were pleased to have more from the 80's and after than in previous years. Hopefully we'll have even more next year after the word gets around to the younger classes about how great the food is and how much fun everyone had reminiscing and dancing! Class of 1964, celebrating their 50th reunion, had the most attendees – a total of 52. Class of 1953 had such a good time celebrating their 60th reunion with us last year, they've decided to do it every year! They had the second most attendees this year. Class of 1963 had so much fun celebrating their 50th last year, they came in with the third most attendees.

The evening got off to a lively start with the LVHS Color Guard, marching band and cheerleaders entering the ballroom. After performing the Alma Mater and a few cheers, the band played "Viva Las Vegas".

Miriam O'Donnell Pemberton, class of 1955, was presented the "Outstanding Alumni of the Year" award for her outstanding support and work on the Wildcat Reunion Committee for the last nine years.

NOTABLE ALUMNI CORNER . . .

BETTY WHITEHEAD WILLIS (Class of 1941)



Betty Whitehead Willis is the pioneer commercial artist and designer of many of the neon signs in Las Vegas. Her most well-known creation is the "WELCOME TO FABULOUS LAS VEGAS" sign on the South Las Vegas Strip, which was created in 1959.

Betty's parents were among the first adventurous souls who journeyed to Las Vegas in 1905, arriving in a horse-drawn wagon. Her father, Stephen Whitehead, was employed as Clark County's first assessor.

Betty was born and raised in Las Vegas. Her family used to travel by train to Los Angeles when she was young and she fell in love with neon signs and their vibrant colors. After studying at the California Art Institute in Pasadena and working in the art department/marketing at the old MGM studios, she returned to Las Vegas and began her career as a Neon Designer. She began her career drawing showgirls in newspaper advertisements for various Las Vegas acts but eventually made the transition to designing neon signs. In addition to the "Welcome to Fabulous Las Vegas" sign, she also designed some of the most iconic signs in Las Vegas.

including the Moulin Rouge and Blue Angel, just to name a few.

At the time female commercial artists were few and far between. As Betty told the Chicago Sun Times, "Most people are surprised when they find out a woman designed the sign. It was a man's business back then. It wasn't a woman's field because when you work with neon signs, you have to not only design them, but you have to learn the nuts and bolts of how neon, light and electricity work. You have to learn about pressure points and weight and wattage of lamps. You work with engineers as well as artists. Most women back then weren't interested in such technical stuff."

In 1952 Willis was approached by Ted Rogich, a local salesman, who suggested that she design a sign that would welcome visitors to the city. The sign had to reflect the relatively new, flashy neon age and serve as an impressive gateway for the town. Willis embarked on developing a sign that was unique in shape, style and content. The sign is 25 feet tall and does have distinctive features. The diamond shape immediately differentiates it from others. In a nod to Nevada's nickname "the Silver State", seven silver dollars back the seven letters of the word "Welcome". In 1959, when the sign was completed, Willis and Rogich sold it for \$4000 to Clark County officials, who placed the sign on an island on the southern tip of the Strip, where it remains today.

In hopes that the design would be used freely, Willis never copyrighted her sign's design. Today, clothing, food, various so uvenirs, and Nevada license plates are just some of the many items that bear the likeness of Willis' design. It is often seen in Las Vegas TV advertisements. The sign has become so iconic of Las Vegas that it was chosen as the official logo for the Las Vegas Centennial celebration in 2005. It has become one of the most photographed tourist attractions in Las Vegas. Betty continued to design signs until retiring in 2001. In 2003, Betty did all the art work for the restoration of the Senior Squares at the entrance of the 7th and Bridger campus. Thanks Betty!!

SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE by Matt Shlisky (1964)



We have so much to feel good about. Our scholarship program, grants program, the fabulous Wildcat Float, are all indications of the health of our organization. The LVHSAA has 477 members, which sounds like a lot. But, when you think of all the graduates over the years, is it really? We have relatively few members from the classes of the 70s, 80s and 90s. And the new campus is already 20 years old. We should have members from those later decades, if we are to continue to grow.

What is the biggest handicap to encouraging new members who attended the old campus? The comment I hear most often from them is that they do not identify with the new campus. This is only heard from those alum who have never visited the new campus. All those who have visited and have seen the degree to which our legacy is so proudly displayed, would never feel a lack of connection with the new school. If they could see the trophies, photos, and other memorabilia in the glass cases lining the cafeteria, as well as in the room dedicated to the old campus, the connection would be felt. Anyone who has participated in the Golden Grads Program has felt a bond with the new campus. They provide a luncheon, at no cost, to those who choose to participate in the ceremony. The Las Vegas High School Alumni Association's grants program was established to assist LVHS faculty in obtaining teaching materials that the school district doesn't supply. The program, administered by LVHSAA Vice President Bruce Langson, recently received its

first requests from Mr. Bull's Math-Science class, and Ms. Carter's Theater Department. The supplies were presented to both classes on Tuesday, October 21, by LVHSAA Scholarship Chairman, Matt Shlisky. We at LVHSAA hope other teachers will take advantage of our program to give their students a more positive high school experience.

LVHS GRADUATION CEREMONY (By Matt Shlisky, 1964)

One of the most important experiences a young person will have in their early life is their graduation from high school, signifying one's entry into adulthood. Las Vegas High School, being the oldest high school in the city, started its graduation ceremonies in the early 1930s. The school graduated its seniors on Butcher Field, the football field adjacent to the school at 7th & Bridger. I graduated there in 1964. Ceremonies continued there till the late 1980s, when all high schools in the valley began graduating their students at the Thomas & Mack Center. What the venue provided in comfort from the heat of late spring, it lost in intimacy and parental involvement. Parents had to meet their students in the parking lot in the mid day heat.

Then a few years ago, LVHS Principal Debbie Brockett had the brilliant idea to move the graduation ceremony to the campus football field in the cool of the early evening. What a wonderful experience it has become! With the inclusion of the Golden Grads (I participated with my class of 1964 this year), the ceremony has taken on a real family feeling. Parents are able to greet their grads on the football field at graduation's end. And with LVHS being the only high school to celebrate this way, it's even more special. Hats off to Mrs. Brockett and her staff for all their efforts.
