



LLOYD CASEY (Class of 1945)

Lloyd Casey was in the LVHS Class of 1945. He quit school in August, 1944 to join the Navy. While his classmates were establishing football history, he was on a destroyer in the South Pacific.

He retired as a Quality Engineer with Storage Technology Corp., which later became Sun and is now Oracle.

Lloyd was elected to the Colorado General Assembly as a Senator in November, 1992 and served until 1996. He was the first person to sponsor a bill to allow farmers to grow industrial hemp which was grown during World War II to supply fiber for ship lines, parachute rigging and cloth shoes. Such a bill has still not been passed, but there are now ten states with bills pending.

Lloyd married Grace Wells of Baltimore, MD in 1949. They have five sons and two daughters, and thirteen grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

Lloyd's brothers also graduated from LVHS - Bob Casey (Class of 1947) and Donald Casey (Class of 1943).
