NOTABLE ALUMNI CORNER . . .

MYRAM BORDERS (CLASS OF 1954)



Myram Borders moved with her family from Kentucky to Nevada in 1940 when she was 4 years old. She attended the historic Fifth Street Grammar School, and graduated in 1954 from Las Vegas High School where she was a reporter for the Desert Breeze. She was awarded a Harold's Club Scholarship and attended the University of Nevada, Reno and graduated from their school of journalism with a Bachelor of Arts degree. During her senior year at UNR, she interned at United Press International in Reno and, upon graduation, went to work for UPI full-time, later transferring to the San Diego bureau, then Los Angeles and, ultimately, to Las Vegas as the bureau manager from 1965 to 1990. In 1992 Myram was named chief of the Las Vegas News Bureau, a post she held for a decade. She directed a staff of writers and photographers in providing domestic and international media with information and graphics promoting Las Ve-

gas as a worldwide travel destination. Upon retirement, she opened the first full-time Las Vegas office for Gannet Newspapers before accepting an appointment as Nevada Commissioner of Consumer Affairs.

While with UPI, Myram appeared worldwide as she reported from Las Vegas on Nevada gaming, politics, organized crime, race riots, Strip hotel fires, the Howard Hughes era, nuclear testing at the Nevada Test Site, Strip entertainment, labor unrest, celebrity divorces and weddings and the antics of Super Stars of the yesterday, i.e. Judy Garland, Elvis Presley, Frank Sinatra etc. She covered the Beatles' arrival in Las Vegas in 1964 when they performed at the Las Vegas Convention Center. She also broke the news story of Elvis Presley's 1967 wedding to Priscilla at the Aladdin Hotel-Casino chapel after getting a tip. She went to the Aladdin and waited all night. At 8 o'clock in the morning, she noticed a Nevada Supreme Court justice walking into the casino and asked if he was there to marry Elvis, and he confirmed it. She was the first reporter to file the story about the wedding. In 1981, she was the first reporter on the scene of the car bombing involving mobster Frank "Lefty" Rosenthal. "As I drove by Tony Roma's and Marie Callender's, I heard this huge boom," Borders told the Las Vegas Sun. 'A guy was getting out of a car sort of smoky and his hair was standing on end."

Myram served three terms as president of the Las Vegas chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists and was instrumental in drafting and helping get Nevada's open meeting law on the books, which passed at the 11th hour by the Nevada Legislature and was signed into law in 1977 by then-Governor Mike O'Callaghan. She also was the only journalist appointed to a Nevada Supreme Court Blue Ribbon Commission which cleared the way for cameras to shoot in Nevada courtrooms. Additionally, Myram anchored "Nevada Week in Review" on Vegas PBS for two years and moderated numerous statewide televised political debates over a 10-year period sponsored by the League of Women Voters.

During her career, Myram traveled the world with stops in Europe, Asia, Africa, Antarctica, Australia, South America and throughout North America. She retired in 2002 and lives in Las Vegas.

Many of us remember **The El Sombrero Café** on South Main Street. It is the oldest Mexican restaurant in town and doesn't look much different today than it did when it opened in 1950! A lot of our alumni still go there for lunch! The owners say they get visits from seniors who remember walking over from Las Vegas High School for a bean burrito after school in the 1950s, or sweeping the floors for a free taco! *We are very sad to report that it may be closing this year - possibly the end of April.* El Sombrero has been owned and operated by the same family for generations. It was opened by Clemente Griego in 1950 and taken over by his nephew Jose Aragon in 1970. Other family members wait tables. Jose has been cooking there since he was 14! He is now 70 and is hoping to retire soon. We'll sure miss the El Sombrero!! Hopefully someone will buy it and carry on the traditions and recipes!

THANKS FOR THE MEMORIES - From Anne Goldberg Hodgdon (1964)...

People tease me about growing up in Las Vegas. But as unlikely as it might seem, growing up in Las Vegas in its early days was as perfect as life could be. It may be that the early Mormon influence of "home and family" coalesced with the "new folks" who arrived from the big cities with big money to create opulent gambling resorts but wanted their transplanted families to have a sense of stability. Whatever it was, it was magical! The movie "American Graffiti" best depicts my fun years at Las Vegas High School. The new Senior Squares Monument pays homage to a great tradition at LVHS, where each graduating class from 1941 to 1988 painted its square on the concrete in the plaza area approaching the wide stairway to the grand front doors of the school. The squares for the four years of WWII were later designed by the same student (Betty Whitehead Willis, class of 1941) who designed the famous "Welcome to Las Vegas" sign that still identifies Las Vegas today. During my high school years, it was hallowed ground; only Seniors were permitted to use that entrance, and we all walked around the squares - never on them. But as time wore on, they deteriorated. Some clever folks from our alumni association raised money over the past two years to have a free-standing memorial made in that plaza area which will survive all of us and remind everyone who sees it that LVHS had heart and soul, and provided great educational and growth opportunities to its students. Thanks for the memories Las Vegas High School Alumni Association. And GO WILDCATS!!


