

We are planning to honor the LVHS Rhythmettes at this year's WILDCAT REUNION. We'll even have a special table set up for you and your guests!



## EVELYN STUCKEY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DEDICATED

The new elementary school named after Evelyn Stuckey was dedicated on February 2, 2011.



Evelyn Stuckey arrived in the Las Vegas community in 1948 to teach physical education at Las Vegas High School. Shortly after beginning her position at Las Vegas High School, she visited Radio City Music Hall in New York City and saw the famous Rockettes perform. Feeling that the young women at Las Vegas High School were missing out on the camaraderie that many of the male athletes experienced, she decided to take this concept back to her classroom and create a drill team for girls. This new group became the Rhythmettes. Evelyn Stuckey was known by her students as tough, but a fair taskmaster

who required every member of the Rhythmettes team to maintain a 3.0 grade point average. She claimed membership in the squad would teach grace, self-esteem and leadership. She incorporated the values of teamwork, self-discipline and goal-setting.

The Rhythmettes made their debut in 1950 and became popular nationwide as the wholesome ambassadors of Las Vegas. They traveled from coast to coast, making appearances in Hollywood, New York City, and in 1964, the group represented Nevada at the World's Fair. The Rhythmettes were also featured on the Ed Sullivan Show and on the Wide World of Sports. These goodwill ambassadors also made numerous appearances locally as the feature in events such as the annual Hellsdorado Days. In fact, in 2005, over two dozen alumni of the Rhythmettes gathered once more to honor Evelyn Stuckey by marching in the Hellsdorado Parade that marked the 100th anniversary of Las Vegas.

Evelyn Stuckey was named Las Vegas Woman of the Year in 1954 and Nevada Outstanding Citizen in 1964. The Rhythmettes disbanded in 1966 due to Stuckey's poor health. They were restarted in 1974 and she advised them until 1979. Evelyn Stuckey died in April, 1980 at the age of 59.



## NOTABLE ALUMNI CORNER . . .

### **MEET ROOSEVELT TOSTON (LVHS Class of 1961)**



Roosevelt Toston graduated from LVHS in 1961. He is originally from Epps, Louisiana. He left at age 16. After graduating from LVHS, Roosevelt attended UNLV, where he majored in Business Administration. He received an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Business Management from the Clark County Community College.

Roosevelt is currently CEO of the Toston Group, Inc., a Las Vegas consulting company that he established more than six years ago. He provides meeting planning and destination management services for regional and national organizations desiring local expertise. He distributes requests for hotel proposals, arranges site inspections, golf tournaments, group transportation, and other convention needs.

Roosevelt has been a resident of Las Vegas for 51 years and has secured a place in Nevada history. He is considered a trailblazer for his many accomplishments. He is the State's first African American Television News Anchorman/reporter. He served five years in broadcast news at NBC and CBS affiliate stations. He also worked in radio news. Roosevelt has traveled the world, visiting six continents, extolling the virtues of Las Vegas to travel planners - in the early years with the LVCVA --and conference coordinators. He held various positions with the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority – where he worked 28 years in executive level positions, including Manager of Diversity Marketing.

Roosevelt was recently named by the Las Vegas Black Image Magazine as one of Nevada's 2010 Black Men of Distinction. The men highlighted by the magazine have reached tremendous heights in their careers, while steadily contributing their talents to the people of this state. Representing diverse industries, they are an inspiration to all who seek success in every aspect of life – family, work, and community. They share their passions and display impeccable character and a collective wisdom. These men embody the best for those determined to make historic progress toward a better world. Roosevelt stated "I am passionate about never giving up on my dreams and leaving a legacy of accomplishments that makes my children and grandchildren proud."

As a result of his work in the broadcast industry and with the LVCVA, he has received numerous awards. Among the many honors Roosevelt has received are:

Roosevelt was also named to the 10-member Founding Board of the Caucus of African American Nevadans (CAAN), an organization that was established in February, 2004. Also, in 2008, Roosevelt became affiliated with the Professional Meeting Planning Network (PMPN). While it is noted that he received the Supplier of the Year Award from the National Coalition of Black Meeting Planners, it should also be mentioned that he was the first member, in the 20 year history of NCBMP, to have been awarded both the prestigious Chairman's Award and Supplier of the Year Award - for his contribution to the hospitality industry.

Roosevelt is a member of Second Baptist Church, attending services weekly. In June 2009, he published his first book, an autobiography, entitled: "Beating the Odds in Las Vegas and in Life." It is the story of how a child raised in one of America's poorest rural towns, Epps, LA, followed his dream to become a television news anchor. It was a dream that would lead him to the glimmer and lights of Las Vegas, NV where Toston found that realizing his vision in front of the news camera was only the beginning.

Roosevelt has been married to Gertrude Woods for 37 years and has four children. His hobbies include golfing, traveling, exercising, reading, and attending movies.

## THE 1944 LVHS WILDCAT FOOTBALL TEAM NAMED TO SPORTS HALL OF FAME

The LVHS Wildcat football team of 1944 (highlighted in Wildcat Tales #4) will be inducted into the **Southern Nevada Sports Hall of Fame**, along with St. Louis Rams running back and former Eldorado High star Steven Jackson, Las Vegas 51s Executive Director Don Logan, Olympic gymnastics medalist Tasha Schwikert and Christina M. Hixson, the sole trustee of Lied Foundation. An induction ceremony is planned for June 10, 2011 at the Orleans Arena.

Steve Stallworth, former chairman and member of the hall's board says "this group was one of the most impressive teams in Las Vegas, on and off the field. They certainly embody the mission that we talk about in being leaders and great examples for our youth". The team was undersized at almost every position, but overcame its lack of size partially because of the special bond the players had. Several had been teammates in multiple sports since childhood. Bill "Wildcat" Morris (class of 1945), who was instrumental in building the Thomas & Mack Center and was one of UNLV's top boosters, played linebacker and center, weighing just 166 pounds.

## ALUMNI IN THE NEWS . . .

**RICHARD BRYAN** (1955) was named Las Vegas Government Relations Lawyer of the Year and **ROBERT FAISS** (1954) was named Las Vegas Gaming Lawyer of the Year by Best Lawyers of America for 2011.

LVHSAA President **ROLLIE GIBBS** (1954) was highlighted in this article in the December 15, 2010 Las Vegas Review Journal: "With traffic noise in the background, a man wearing a cowboy hat stood on a newly enhanced section of Sunset Park and told of being born at this site 75 years ago when it was a ranch. Then, the main way of traveling across the rough terrain was by horseback.

"I learned how to ride before I learned how to walk" Rollie Gibbs said at a ceremony marking \$11 million in upgrades to 140 acres of the park. Gibbs and his brother Sonny, were sons of the ranch's caretaker, Bert Gibbs. Their stories punctuated the fertile history of the evolving 325-acre park. A notable feature of Sunset Park is its artesian wells. "These underground springs aided bootleggers, said Rollie. They would go to mesquite groves, knowing the springs fed the trees, and scoop water flowing from the ground to use in making liquor. Rollie said his father, who was a deputy, never bothered the bootleggers. Mysteriously, he was never short on whiskey, Rollie said, smiling. "People looked out for each other" he said.



She would like to encourage all alumni (especially those of us that lived here in the 50s, 60s and 70s), to visit the newly opened "Building Atomic Vegas" exhibit at the museum located at 755 E. Flamingo Road. The exhibit explores how Las Vegas became the Atomic City at all levels. See how atomic power touched history, sociology and pop culture. Businesses used Atomic Era symbols to set them apart, and Las Vegas became the home to everything from Atomic Liquors to Atomic Cleaners. The mushroom cloud graced marquees, billboards, newspaper advertisements and even high school yearbooks (LVHS class of 1953). Restaurants served atomic burgers and atomic cocktails.
